I am responding as an individual and requesting confidentiality regarding my name and address.

An environmental impact study organization to which I belong has been unable to successfully download the corridor route maps from the web site, despite a number of attempts. Apparently there is some technical problem with the web site, server or file characteristics that has prevented at least some requesters from downloading and viewing the maps. Please make a map of the routing available to commenters who make reasonable attempts to view and download them from the web site. This will allow a process that can include input from the public and voluntary organizations. As a result of not being able to view the routing of the corridor, apparently due to technical problems with downloading the maps, the organization to which I belong has not been able to prepare comments on the potential environmental impacts of the corridor. Please address the functionality of the downloading feature of the web site to enable all interested members of the public to download the maps and view them. The organization to which I belong needs more time for adequate research and preparation of comments. I therefore request an extension of the public comment period by 60 days, to September 10, 2006.
